

Scholarship Opportunities

Blue & Gold Opportunity Plan

UC tuition and student fees will be covered by grants and/or scholarships for eligible California students from families with incomes under \$80,000.

Only 1 tuition paying grant is allowed (Cal, Grant, Cal Vet, etc.) and Blue & Gold will not apply.

Undergraduate Dean's Award

Awarded to select incoming non-resident students and international students

FROSH - awards of \$12,000 to \$40,000 over four years

Campus Merit Scholarship

Campus Merit Scholarships are awarded to students in recognition of both academic achievement and demonstrated financial need. Awards are \$2000 per year for four years.

JUN 2 Priority deadline for fall aid applicants to submit

documents on their MyUCSC To Do List

JUL 1- SEPT 1 New students will receive an e-mail when an official financial aid

offer is ready to review on MyUCSC.

LATE AUGUST After you accept an aid offer, you may use our Payment Estimator

to estimate how much you will owe for the quarter.








Residency Process



Four residence requirements students (and parents) must be fulfill to qualify for a resident classification at the University of California.

- 1. Physical Presence
- 2. Intent to Remain in California



- 3. Financial Independence
- 4. Immigration Status: Citizen, Permanent Resident or Qualifying Non-Immigrant

- Petition for Change of Legal Residence Status (Continuing)
- AB540 Application/Affidavit

UCSC California residence for tuition purposes



Residency: Exemptions and Exceptions

Commonly approved exemptions/exceptions

- AB540: Nonresident Tuition Exemption
- Condit Exemption: Dependent of CA Resident Parent
- Military Exemption: Stationed in California

Dreamers Financial Options

California Dream Act - Dreamers

- Undocumented or applied status for Permanent Resident
- AB540 Eligible must fulfill California high school criteria
- Receives nonresident or resident classification
- May receive Nonresident Tuition Exemption
- Assessed in-state fees
- Unable to file FAFSA
- UC Santa Cruz Grants
- Cal Grant A & B
- Institutional Work-Study
- California DREAM Loan
- Scholarships (Departmental & Private)
